

#### Coralwood School

Coralwood School is the only public school in DeKalb County dedicated to serving children with special needs between three and six years of age. Our research-based educational model includes

12 collaborative and co-teaching classrooms in which six to eight children with special needs and ten typically developing children are educated together. Research shows that this model results in significant gains for special education students, including higher levels of social play, more appropriate social interactions and greater gains in language, cognitive and motor development. Additionally, Coralwood has four self-contained classrooms that serve children with more severe disabilities. Children in the self-contained classes engage in multiple learning experiences with typically developing children throughout the school day.

The classrooms at Coralwood are led by highly specialized teachers and paraprofessionals who teach to a broad set of students with varied needs. The teachers work closely with the following therapists: speech/language, occupational, physical, vision and recreational. Primarily, these therapists provide services to children in the classroom and include both special needs and typical children in various therapies.

# Victory in every classroom?

## You can't put children first if you put teachers last.

Right now, the DeKalb County School System is in crisis given its budgetary shortfalls and the SACS investigation. Coralwood School is not. It's an ongoing battle but our program is growing every day thanks to the support of the Coralwood Foundation and our entire community. Why is our school different?

When we learned that DeKalb County was cutting teacher and paraprofessional salaries in our program, the Coralwood Foundation responded. The Foundation is dedicating a large part of this year's Coralwood Challenge (our annual fund) to filling in the gaps in these salaries and in training for new teachers. You see, we love our staff. We have an emotional as well as financial investment in them. We are as committed to their learning and professional development as they are to the learning and development of our students.

Excellence in education does not happen automatically. Teachers need training and support. We have spent thousands of dollars in classroom improvements, supplies and equipment. More importantly, we have invested in training Coralwood's staff in Orton-Gillingham and Lindamood-Bell reading methodologies, PROMPT speech therapy, and Floortime and ABA therapies, to name a few. This training includes ALL staff, not just special education teachers. Our general education teachers and paraprofessionals are highly trained to effectively deliver research-based methodologies to our students. We don't mess around. Coralwood is "top drawer," as Janet's grandmother used to say.

Why bother? We have a limited window of opportunity to really impact these children's educational lives in meaningful ways. So, we create differentiated learning opportunities using a variety of approaches. For example, children with autism struggle with abstract concepts. We trained teachers several years ago in Lindamood-Bell Visualizing and Verbalizing strategies and now our staff teaches children to create pictures in their heads as they read. This builds reading comprehension by helping students bridge the gaps between written words and their meanings.

As Coralwood principal and the Foundation president, we are constantly on the lookout for new ways to reach and teach children. We encourage teachers and therapists to investigate new techniques and new training seminars to attend. The Coralwood Foundation has funded up to \$20,000 per year for teachers' professional development. Teachers gain important skills, students' individualized needs are met and our program grows in rich and diverse ways. You see an immediate impact in the way your child learns.

A school needs a vision to reach the unique potential of its learning community. We started the Coralwood Foundation from scratch. Now we are poised to move successfully into the future, despite the disastrous state of DCSS. What does your child need to be happy and successful? Let's do whatever we can to make sure they have it.

#### 2011-2012 Major Coralwood Foundation Accomplishments



- Purchased a **rock wall** for the Motor Therapy room and tricycles for the playground
- © Created a new social skills summer camp called **Camp Incredible**. Fifty campers attended this three-week camp in June. The camp was based on the Superflex Curriculum and campers were taught social and problem solving skills in a creative and fun environment.
- Coralwood School received the **Community Partner Award** from Fernbank's School Master Gardner program. "John's first 2 years at Coralwood were in a selfcontained classroom with Holly Adams. At the end of the second year, John was still non-verbal and Susan Garrett, his speech therapist, recommended assistive technology for communication. Over the summer, as that paperwork was being processed, we talked to Holly and told her how John was hanging out in the baby pool and was mimicking the toddlers' babbling. She said it's time to get him in an inclusion class. So when fall came he was placed in Karen Roseberry's 3-year -old inclusion class and within months was talking – single words at first, but more than enough to make a communication device unnecessary. All of the adults in his life for 4 years couldn't teach John to talk - his peers, the children at Coralwood did. That's what inclusion is all about to us."


#### What is the Coralwood Foundation?

Coralwood Foundation, Inc. was incorporated in May 2005 to create a permanent endowment fund, the income of which is used to promote excellence in early childhood special education at Coralwood School, and to provide a vehicle for long-term financial and volunteer support for Coralwood. The Foundation funds the educational innovations of teachers and other professionals at Coralwood and as well as a Director of Development who writes grants and raises funds for specific educational initiatives

Currently, the efforts of the Foundation's Board of Directors are focused on the following initiatives:

- Providing learning opportunities, grants for classroom initiatives and professional development for our school staff;
- Supporting the financial goals of the Foundation through fundraisers such as our Annual Auction and Wine Tasting, as well as grant writing activities:
- Working with the DeKalb County School System (DCSS) and the Board of Education to fund the Master Plan for Coralwood's campus in order to provide enhanced educational opportunities for our children;
- Implementing a marketing and communications plan that will position Coralwood School as the premier inclusion school in Georgia;
- Launching the website as a central location for comprehensive information about Coralwood and the Foundation, the PTA, related events and parent resources;
- Actively engaging Coralwood alumni, parents and friends in the continued work of the Foundation through community involvement and outreach as part of the "Coralwood Circle of Friends" group.

The Foundation views these projects as fundamental elements to improve the education of our children now and in the future.

"Rusty was not talking at age 3, we learned that he had water in his ears for at least 18 months. Coralwood did an evaluation on Rusty and he was offered the last slot in a new type of classroom called "inclusion". I believe this was the school year 1999-2000. Mrs. Rice was the principal and Mrs. Blanton was the counselor. Mrs. Blanton was so kind in the way she explained all the difficulties that Rusty was having. But she also explained his strengths which I have held onto dearly. I am now seeing her insight come to be reality. Rusty received speech every day and he received a lot of one-on-one positive instruction since he did not understand (hear) what was being asked of him. He received tubes in his ears and then he started to learn to talk. Rusty attended Coralwood for three years, preschool, kindergarten and 1st grade.

All through elementary school Rusty would remind me how much he missed Coralwood and all of his teachers. We have gone back to visit Coralwood several times. The changes of the building are very noticeable but one thing has not changed at all—the way the children are treated and nurtured to bring out the best in each child.

I am so very grateful to the staff who developed the inclusion program and to all of the teachers and staff who made the program a success. The children in that first class are now Juniors in high school. When asked about Coralwood I know they will light up with a smile and say they loved Coralwood."

"At 18 months, my son Robbie was showing signs of speech delay along with sensory issues related to pickiness with food and self regulation. We began speech occupational therapy 3–4 times a week. Robbie's progress was slow and steady. He needed more than just therapy sessions, he needed to be understood and engaged by his teachers and therapists all day along with his peers. We knew we had to get Robbie into a better school that was educated on special needs. Robbie was evaluated at Coralwood Diagnostic Center a month before his 3rd birthday and when he turned three he was placed in Coralwood School for the next school year with a very thorough Individual Education Plan (IEP). After doing research on schools in the area, we were so excited and grateful to get a spot for him there.

When Robbie started school he spoke about 10–20

spontaneous single words a day, he had started pointing as a form of communication—and he had finally started saying mommy! The first day he started Coralwood there was a change. After school, we asked him to get his shoes so we could go outside and play. That was the first day that he actually looked for and got his shoes! By the middle of his second year at Coralwood, Robbie talks in full sentences, understands and responds to our questions, has small conversations, talks from the moment he wakes until he goes to bed. With his budding language, comes emerging social qualities. I credit most of his progress to Coralwood and his awesome teachers and speech therapists who really understand him. And, of course, his typical peers who add to Robbie's character every day. He still has a lot of work to do but he is on his way. Robbie is the hardest working person I know and we are very proud."


